I hope these words find you enjoying bright and spring time green. Winter this year has been a renter that has overstayed its expiration date.

In the Bible, Acts 13, Paul is preaching and he is using King David as an illustration that shares an ongoing pattern of positive reality in our world. In verse 36 *“When David had served God’s purposes in his generation, he died.”* That got me thinking about God’s purpose for my life and yours. What does it mean for us to serve God in our generation? MISSIONS



2022 LOVE OFFERING

Each year, churches in the Minnesota Annual Conference take a Love Offering for missions. The offering is brought to annual conference session, a gathering of United Methodist clergy and laity from across the state.

The theme of the 2022 Annual Conference session taking place in St. Cloud on May 24-25 is "Jesus: Healer." The Love Offering provides the opportunity to bring healing in the name and spirit of Jesus.

The funds from this year's offering will go to five projects: The Red Bird Missionary Conference (40 percent), Holy Grounds at Centenary UMC, Mankato (17 percent), Simpson Food Pantry, Minneapolis (17 percent), West African Family and Community Food Shelf, Brooklyn Center (17 percent), and Volunteers in Mission Scholarships (10 percent).

THE RED BIRD MISSIONARY CONFERENCE

The Red Bird Missionary Conference, which is undergoing a revitalization process and will soon be called Central Appalachian Missionary Conference, is a United Methodist community in the eastern Kentucky region. The 2022 Love Offering funds will be used for disaster response after recent severe flooding damaged churches and homes.

HOLY GROUNDS

A ministry of Centenary UMC in Mankato, Holy Grounds serves a warm breakfast to 40 to 50 people, six mornings a week. Your Love Offering gift will support the purchase of a new convection oven and provide needed funds to shift into post-pandemic ministry.

SIMPSON FOOD PANTRY

Simpson Food Pantry has been meeting the needs of food insecure neighbors in South Minneapolis for 50 years. Demand has tripled since the start of the pandemic. The 2022 Love Offering dollars will come at a most opportune time—as the aging Simpson building will be razed to the ground, the food pantry is searching for a new location.

WEST AFRICAN FAMILY AND COMMUNITY FOOD SHELF

Brooklyn UMC in Brooklyn Center started a culturally-specific food shelf to serve its neighbors, primarily West African immigrants and low-income families. Your donations will provide household items, hygienic products, and culturally-specific food items to this community.

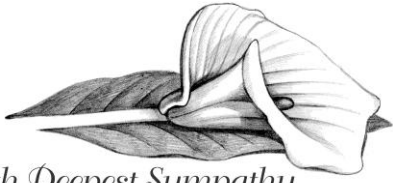
VOLUNTEERS IN MISSION SCHOLARSHIPS
