

PASTOR WAYNE'S WORLD

Greetings to family and friends within the orbit of Fridley UMC.

I've been thinking about why do we think the way we do and why should we care? What determines our gut level response that guides our thoughts, words, and actions? What people believe to be true and real, for example, determines what will be bestowed on the generations to follow.

Cultures need a core set of values upon which the society shares general agreement. Without some broad consensus on what is the Good, the Beautiful and the True, a society will disintegrate.

Before Christianity touched Rome, human life was exploitable and expandable. The economy was driven by slave labor, revolts to gain freedom were brutally crushed and gladiatorial death matches made for public entertainment.

Then came Jesus Christ, and then came the followers of Jesus Christ. Christians brought the creation account of Genesis into this Roman Empire of death and decadence. Gradually, over centuries, the awareness that humankind had been created and bear the image of God, brought dignity and bore fruit and flourishing that changed society's laws. Transformed practices followed with the rise of Christianity. Many of the greatest achievements of Western civilization grew out of the biblical roots of Judeo-Christian foundations.

I see compelling evidence in the West, where Christianity is increasingly marginalized and its influence waning, that we are returning to the old Roman gods of hyper-sexualization, pagan spirituality, situational ethics, a disregard for human life, and the elevation of tolerance as the sole absolute virtue.

It is unsettling and uncomfortable to see the undermining of the Judeo-Christian foundation of human dignity. We are acting more and more like the Romans of old.

Thank God, we have the promise that Jesus will continue to build his Family (church) that the gates of hell cannot withstand. (Matthew 16:18)



Thank you for ensuring young people experiencing homelesness in our community feel safe, valued and supported.


