PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The Itinerant Journey

In the United Methodist Church pastors are itinerant. This means that they are willing to uproot themselves and go where sent on a moment's notice (or a month's notice or possibly two or three.) And they are willing to do so, to journey forth, whether an itinerary exists or not.

When writing about "The Itinerant Journey" African American scholar and Methodist preacher Renita Weems has this to say:

"Normally, someone who just takes off on a journey with no earthly idea where she is going is called a vagabond, a bum, a Gypsy. But I am called a Reverend."

I, too, am called a Reverend, though I prefer to be called Pastor Donna or simply Donna. After many twists and turns, my itinerant journey has led me to Fridley United Methodist Church as an interim pastor – my second such appointment. I've also served as an associate pastor, an executive pastor, and a senior pastor.

So what is my itinerary as an interim pastor?

In my first sermon (you can watch it on YouTube if you missed it,) I mentioned a three-fold pathway:

- 1. Learn your names and hear your stories.
- 2. Discern where God's Spirit is already at work in your midst.
- 3. Collaborate with you to follow God's leading in this time and place.

How am I to do this? How am I to follow this itinerary? For the first one, I enjoy coffee, lemonade, ice cream, lunch, conversations at the church, conversations in your home. Said differently, I enjoy visiting. My life is enriched when I gather around the table with another. Please call or email if you'd like to get together to share stories and to get know each other by name.

For the second and third, our District Superintendent has outlined an itinerary that states:

- 1. Bring continuity to the ministries of Fridley and nurture health and vitality during the season of transition.
- 2. Plan, coordinate, and lead Sunday worship that invites congregational engagement in assisting in the services.
- 3. Lead and supervise staff.
- 4. Collaborate and guide Fridley through a discernment process around clarifying their missional identity and ministry vitality.

5. Help clarify the role of pastor and the appropriate governing structure for Fridley's present size.

We have a pathway forward, yet, I am aware that it is not my itinerary – or even our District Superintendent's – that we follow. It is God's, and God takes us in directions we may never imagine.

I look forward to being with you this year, and experiencing the journey God has in store.


MEN'S BIBLE STUDY

MISSIONS



TAMARISK – AUGUST SPECIAL MISSION

Tamarisk, located in Anoka, is a non-profit organization that provides support for families caring for a family member facing a progressive or terminal health diagnosis. In 1983, founder Gretchen Hanson came to realize how unprepared she and her family were to handle the emotional issues and the end-of-life care of her father.

Tamarisk came into being in 1993. Its mission is to create a caring presence and a safe haven for the thoughts, feelings, and concerns of people, and their families, faced with the end stages of terminal illness. Volunteers are trained to focus on a family member's non-medical needs, while simultaneously providing much-needed respite to caregivers.

The name "Tamarisk" comes from the Bible story of Abraham offering comfort to strangers crossing the desert. He gave them water and offered rest under the shade of the Tamarisk tree.

In 2022, the Tamarisk program supported 21 active volunteers who donated 1,100 companion volunteer hours through 300 volunteer visits with the

families they serve. Since Tamarisk began collecting data, they have amassed 58,000 companion volunteer hours and served 1,580 families.

Our Fridley United Methodist Church congregation is living in an aging community. Adult children and relatives may not have anticipated the physical, emotional and financial toll this care will have on their family. Caregivers also need support to take care of their own health and life's demands. Tamarisk volunteers help meet that need.

Members of our church have personally volunteered for Tamarisk and have been recipients of the supportive services of a Tamarisk volunteer. Jeff Mondloh was referred to Tamarisk to help support his mother whose Parkinson's disease had brought her into hospice end stage care. Tamarisk volunteer Jean inspired confidence that his mother would be well cared for during the three hours she was there each week. They developed a close friendship which blossomed with conversations about interests they shared. Jean continued to visit even during the short time Jeff's mother was in the nursing home, just before her death.

Tamarisk's trained volunteers are available to provide a supportive presence through conversation, reading, playing cards or just being there so the family member can have a few hours to themselves. Some Tamarisk volunteers have even been matched with individuals who were able to go into the community for shopping or a trip to a favorite restaurant.

The emotional support and physical care this organization's volunteers provide are in high demand. Please take time to learn more about Tamarisk through examining the informative bulletin board in our church hall. Perhaps you know someone who could benefit from their services. Your referral may bring wonderful support to a family in your neighborhood.
