DARKNESS & LIGHT

Stores are playing "Joy to the World," Starbucks is serving Gingerbread Tea Lattes in red cups, and trees on every corner are aglow with radiant lights. We are rushing full force toward Christmas. Soon we'll be lighting candles and hearing John declare, "God is light and in God there is no darkness at all," and Isaiah proclaim, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light."


Our towns and cities are filled with images of bustle and brightness. Yet the coming of the Christ child does not take place in a splash of artificial light, but in the darkness of night.

In the Northern Hemisphere, the season of Advent – the four weeks leading up to Christmas – comes during some of the longest nights of the year. We often refer to darkness in negative terms. We think of the darkness of terror in our world – in Palestine and Israel, Ukraine, and Uvalde, Texas. There is also the darkness of anguish in our lives – depression, addiction, angst, illness, trauma. Terror and anguish weigh heavy on our hearts.

Advent is not a time to artificially light the darkness, but to trust that even in the depths of darkness God is present. God is with those who lose their lives in acts of terror; God is with those who engage in acts of compassion; God is with those who march for justice; God is with those who seek to walk more gently on our planet; God is with those who struggle with their own dark nights of the soul. The season of Advent is a time of germinating, where even in the darkest places, God's thrill of hope takes root.

On Christmas Eve we will hear Isaiah's words, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness – on them light has shined" (Is 9:2). We will welcome the Christ child, Emmanuel, God with Us, knowing that Christ is present even in the darkest corners of our lives. Our worship services on December 24th will be at 10:00 AM and 7:00 PM, with different sermons and music. Consider attending one or both of these services, and inviting a family member, neighbor, or friend.

Children are welcome to attend worship with their family. Children's coloring pages and crayons can be found on the back sanctuary table.



FAMILY TABLE


