


MEN'S BIBLE STUDY

OPEN ARMS – JANUARY SPECIAL MISSION

Open Arms is an exciting new mission for Fridley UMC, but it has been in existence for 30 years! Open Arms' unique program is to prepare and deliver medically tailored meals to Minnesota residents and their families impacted by life-threatening illness. Unlike food pantries, income is not a qualifier for their services. Their made-from scratch, preservative-free meals that clients choose from are crafted for

specific illnesses. All food is cooked and prepared directly in their stateof-the art kitchen, utilizing fresh, organic produce harvested from Open Farms program whenever possible. Meals are delivered once a week by volunteer delivery drivers. Dave Ryan from our church is one of these drivers. Additional meals are provided for caregivers and dependent children if requested.

We learned about Open Arms when we heard that long-time members of our church, Cindy and Jerry Robb, were receiving meals. Open Arms began as a single act of kindness in 1986 when Bill Rowe, the founder, began cooking food in his apartment and delivering it to a handful of neighbors living with AIDS who had had become too sick to cook for themselves. From there it moved into a church. Three decades later their operation has grown into an organization with state-of-the-art facilities in Minneapolis and St. Paul. Meals are now delivered to people with many illnesses such as cancer, MS, ALS and COPD. 6,000 meals are delivered each year. The purpose of Open Arms is to create an inclusive and joyful community to provide high-quality medically tailored meals, nutrition education and hope to their clients. Open Arms is a great blessing to many people—let us do our best to support this outstanding mission with our gifts and prayers!
