YOU'RE IT!

The word *pentekoste* in Greek means 50. It's the fiftieth day after Easter. It's a day when we say, "Come, Holy Spirit, Come!"

Pentecost reminds me of a game I played as a child. The game was called "hide and seek." Some of you may be familiar with this childhood game to hide out and be sought out. For those who have not played, or who have not played for a while, it goes like this: You start all together at home, a place of safety and sanctuary (usually a tree). One person is it. The rest scatter from home and hide while the person who is "it" covers their eyes, counts to twenty, and then shouts, "Ready or not, here I come."

The person who is "it" then seeks the others out: to tag them, to touch them, before they can return to the safety and sanctuary of home.

In the story of Pentecost, the early disciples are all together in one place. It was seven weeks after the Jewish celebration of Passover and Jews from near and far came to Jerusalem again. This time to commemorate Shavuot (also called Pentekoste in Greek, as it's celebrated 50 days after Passover.) It's the day tradition held that the Torah was given to Moses on Mount Sinai.

When the early disciples were gathered all together in one place. As they were hiding out, the Holy Spirit began to move. It swirled and blew, and maybe even whispered in a breathy tone, "Ready or not, here I come." Then the Holy Spirit sought them out; it blew in like a whirlwind, tagging them, touching them, claiming them as "it."

We will be celebrating Pentecost at Fridley UMC on Sunday, May 19. You are invited to wear red, the liturgical color of the Holy Spirit, and your sneakers, because, ready or not, it continues to move among us. It is still tagging us, touching us, and calling us to open our hearts, minds, and doors to all people and all voices. It is still tagging us, touching, us and calling us to be Church in our community and world.

Come, Holy Spirit, Come!

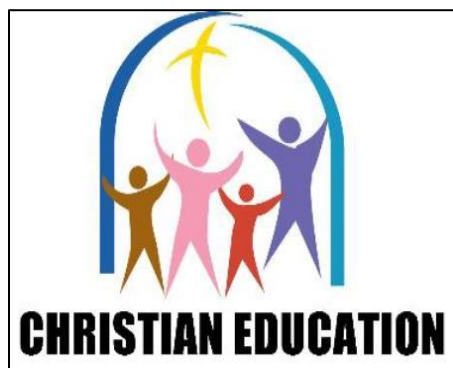

MEN'S BIBLE STUDY

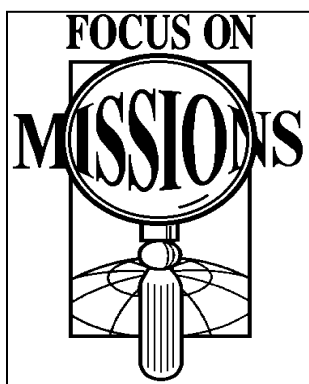

MISSIONS





Mission for May is the MN United Methodist Annual Conference Love Offering.


This year's offering will be divided between 4 organizations which help our neighbors both at home and

abroad heal from trauma and find safety. (% of gift directed to each organization.)

 **A Trauma Care Center in Ukraine (30%)** has been selected in response to the massive mental health impact of war. Through a collaboration with UMCOR, the money will be used to purchase and develop a ministry center for trauma care which currently operates from a hotel near the city of Uzhhorod. The center will be able to immediately house displaced persons suffering from PTSD. Located near one of the strongest Ukrainian United Methodist Congregations, it is hoped that the church will provide a convenient population to recruit volunteers.

 **Legal Clinics partnering with the Volunteer Lawyer Network (VLN) (30%)** are selected to help those facing problems with immigration, citizenship, asylum and humanitarian relief. The VLN will offer legal clinics in Methodist churches sprinkled around Southern/Central Minnesota and Minneapolis. The work will help provide support to Hispanic / Latino Affinity groups by lawyers and para legals offering individual consultation and legal education in group settings.

 **The Emma Norton Services' Restoring Waters housing development (30%)** has been selected to promote their housing project scheduled to open May 14. Creating a home-like calming environment for 60 individuals/small families, the Love offering will provide funding for new programming aimed at reducing trauma through art creation, cooking, gardening, meditation and yoga/movement.

 **Finally, Volunteers in Mission (10%)** has been selected to offer scholarships to United Methodist Volunteer participants who serve in all 50 states and 100 countries. Most 2-week team projects provide hands on support in construction, disaster response, teaching, health care and packing supplies for overseas shipments. The Love offering will help offset the cost to first-time participants with scholarships of \$200 - \$400 per volunteer.

With so much turmoil in the world, we need access to the restorative presence of nature, community and spirituality to enable healing from life's traumas. Please consider donating to the Love Offering to support these worthy causes.
